16 17 18

Measures 16-18 of a piano piece. Measure 16 shows a melodic line in the right hand and a rhythmic accompaniment in the left hand. Measure 17 features a more active melodic line. Measure 18 includes a piano (*p*) dynamic marking.

Measures 28-30. Measure 28 includes a diminuendo (*Dim.*) marking. Measure 29 features a melodic line with a sharp sign (#) above the first note.

31 32 33 34

Measures 31-34. Measure 31 includes a crescendo (*Cresc.*) marking. Measure 33 includes a fortissimo (*ff*) dynamic marking. Measure 34 includes an *Allarg.* (Allargando) marking and a fermata over the final chord.
