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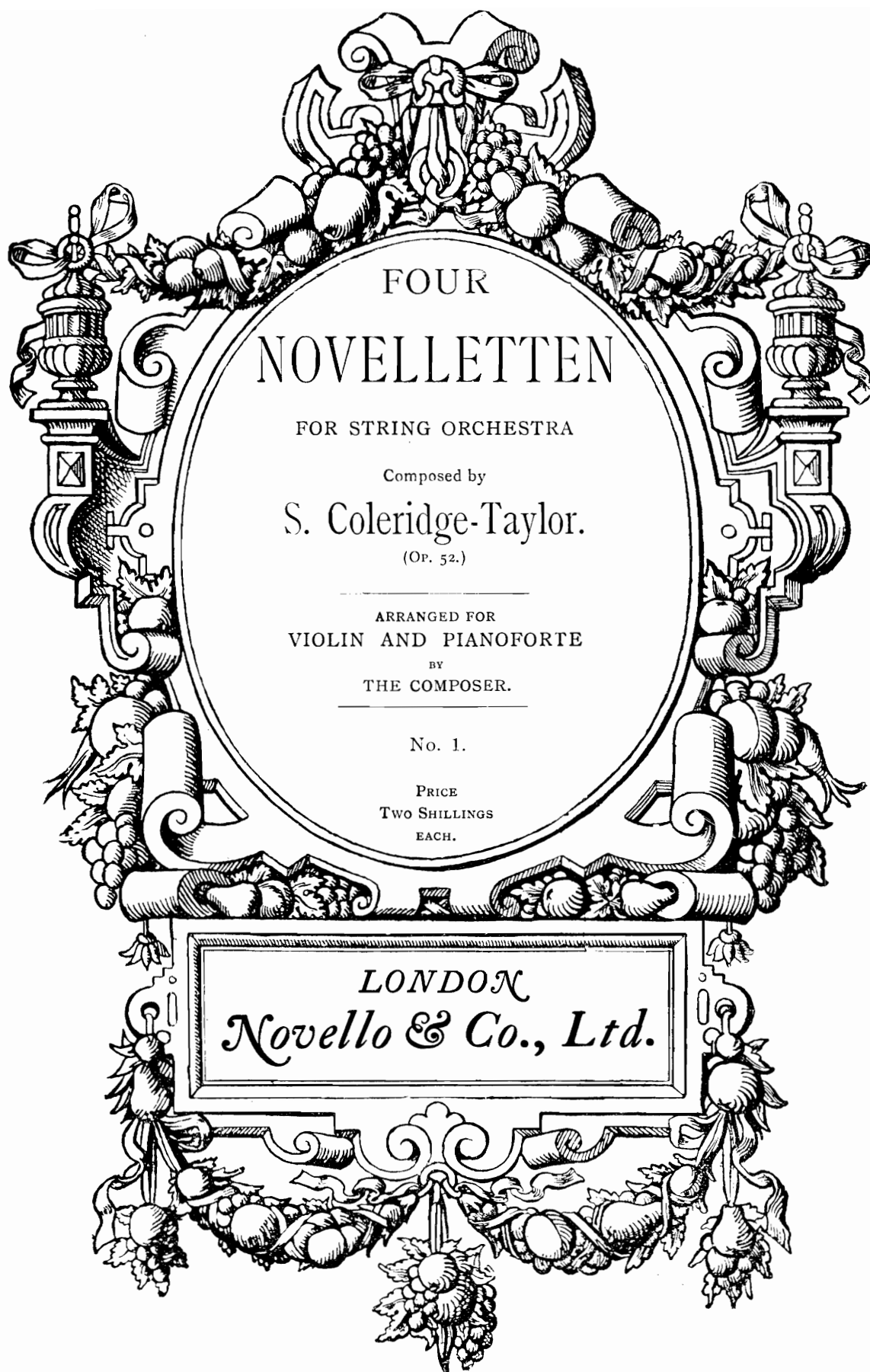
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# NOVELLETTEN.

## I.

S. Coleridge - Taylor.  
Op. 52. I.

*Allegro moderato.*

  5. In D minor.  $\frac{4}{4}$ , Allegro molto marcato; Largamente, con gran espressione.
