Violin 1: Enters with eighth-note pairs. Dynamics: mp .

Violin 2: Enters with eighth-note pairs. Dynamics: mp .

Viola: Enters with eighth-note pairs.

Cello: Enters with eighth-note pairs. Dynamics: mp .

1. **2. rit.**
