Interpretation for Oboe & Piano by Mike Magatagan 2020

Measures 1-4 of the Aria. The music is in G minor, 3/4 time, and begins with a mezzo-forte (mf) dynamic. The right hand features a flowing eighth-note melody, while the left hand provides a steady accompaniment of eighth notes.

Measures 5-10 of the Aria. The right hand continues its melodic line with some grace notes, and the left hand maintains the eighth-note accompaniment.
