

Instrumentation:

Vibraphone I (medium soft mallets)
Vibraphone II (medium soft mallets)
Percussion I (Tibetan singing bowls, Yunluo) standard mallets/beaters
Percussion II (Tam tam, Crotales) standard mallets/beaters

Performance notes concerning tam tam, vibraphones, and crotales:

Scrape- scrape tam tam with triangle beater Arco- use a cello bow to to bow the given instrument Rub with mallet in a clockwise pattern on tam tam at measure 40

Performance notes concerning the singing bowls:

At base- strike at the base of the bowl At rim- strike at the rim of the bowl Rub- rub the beater

Notation for the bowls has been written with triangle noteheads denoting low, mid, and high frequencies. (see percussion notation legend)

A clairvoyant is defined as one who has a supernatural ability to perceive events in either the future or beyond the normal range of sensory contact.

In this work, through the use of extended performance techniques, the enigmatic scale on a tone center of D, and the two semitone tritone scale on a tone center of F, I have attempted to bring the audience into the mind and thoughts of a clairvoyant.
