About the artist

Albert Carrière, né à Liège le 19 janvier 1912, décédé à Bruxelles le 18 juin 1988, était un musicien amateur, ayant pratiqué le chant, l'orgue et le piano.

De 1930 à 1947, il a composé 13 oeuvres : 5 pièces pour piano seul, 7 mélodies ainsi qu'une ballade pour violon et piano.

Ces oeuvres sont toutes disponibles sur free-scores.com.

Elles sont éditées par Jean Paul Carrière.

En 2010, l'éditeur a découvert des oeuvres "de jeunesse" pour orgue, non datées, mais composées pendant qu'Albert Carrière était élève de Henri Deger, organiste à l'Eglise Sainte-Marie-Des-Anges à Liège (de 1925 à 1930). Elles sont au nombre de 7, dont une inachevée, et sont toutes disponibles sur free-scores.com.
