Detailed description: This system covers measures 13 and 14. The Organ part (treble and bass clefs) features a complex melodic line with many sixteenth and thirty-second notes, including grace notes. The Pedal part (bass clef) has a simpler accompaniment with quarter and eighth notes, including some grace notes.
