I would also appreciate comments regarding my scores as this is the only way I may learn and compose better works. I will value and answer all of your e-mails and comments.

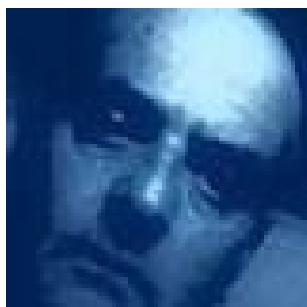
