During those years more than hundred musical pieces, solo and ensembles, in a different genres (classical, jazz, rock and pop-music), from easy to advanced skill level, was arranged by him for alive performance on electronic keyboards with auto accompaniment function (Yamaha-PSR portatones were used generally).
