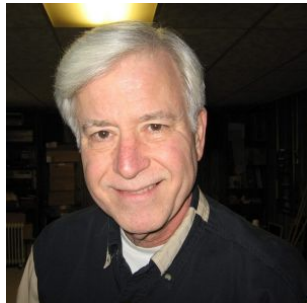
#### About the artist
