Alto Recorder

Bassoon

The first system of music shows measures 1 through 4. The Alto Recorder part is in the treble clef, and the Bassoon part is in the bass clef. Both are in 4/4 time. The melody in the Alto Recorder is a simple, ascending line of eighth notes. The Bassoon part provides a rhythmic accompaniment with eighth notes and some rests.
