Richard Lenz, born in Amsterdam, started to play the guitar at the age of nine. In the Netherlands Richard studied at the Conservatorium in Alkmaar with Tamara Kropat and subsequently at the Conservatorium in Rotterdam with Dick Hoogeveen.

He won two scholarships to help him further his studies overseas in Wales. As a student of the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, Richard undertook his postgraduate studies in Cardiff with guitarist John Mills and also studied period performance practice, visiting early music specialist Nigel North in London. Throughout his studies, Richard played in numerous festivals and master classes with many of the world's leading guitarists.

Richard maintains a busy performance and tuition schedule and has appeared in recitals both as a soloist and in various ensembles, including a Royal Performance.

















Festive Fizz

'Festive Fizz' is a fun, dynamic and festive piece with lots of sparkle. Although Festive Fizz is a classical piece, it uses ideas from the Progressive Rock era, established in the late sixties and early seventies. It was premiered by 'Guitarstrophe!' in December, 2002 and is the title track of an album featuring Guitarstrophe!, the Eden-Stell duo and the National Youth Guitar Ensemble (NYGE).

Carpe Diem

A guitar ensemble work using Requinto and Contrabass guitars (individual bass and treble clef parts included). 'Carpe Diem' is written in three parts and the duration of this piece is ca. 4 mins.

Two Pieces for Guitar Ensemble

- 1. Mid Summer Ballad (ca 1 min. 54).
- 2. Asturiana (ca 2 mins 57).

Hungarian Dance No. 5

Hungarian Dance No. 5 by Johannes Brahms, arranged for Guitar Ensemble by Richard Lenz. This arrangement is in 5 parts and includes parts for Bass Guitar and Requinto. The Guitar 1 part can be played with either Requinto or Standard Guitars.

Inanay

A beautiful Indigenous Australian Lullaby also known as 'Inanay Capuana' arranged for guitar ensemble. Two arrangements are included in this pdf; 'Inanay', an Intermediate Level arrangement in D Major and an easier arrangement, 'Inanay Capuana', in C Major for the Beginning Guitar Ensemble. Both arrangements are in four parts. Includes Acknowledgement of Country.

Seguidilla & Aragonaise (from 'Carmen')

Seguidilla & Aragonaise (from 'Carmen') by Georges Bizet, arranged for Guitar Ensemble by Richard Lenz. Advanced playing level.

Fiesta! (free download)

This edition of Fiesta! is a simplified version of the score published in 'Guitars for Everyone!'. The chords in the Gtr 1 and Gtr 4 parts have been adapted in order to make the parts suitable for students in their early years of learning guitar.

Apache Dreaming (free download)

'Apache Dreaming' is written by Richard Lenz for the beginning (junior) guitar ensemble, in four parts. This file contains a score, individual parts and instructions for improvising an alternative intro and interlude using various percussion sounds created on the guitars. Alternatively percussion instruments may also be used.

A prelude to the popular Romance/Spanish Ballad. Teacher reference: Good for students who are not quite ready to play the bar chords of the E major part of Romance/Spanish Ballad. Intermediate level.

Equinox (free download)

'Equinox' is a bright sounding (grade 3-4) guitar solo.

Illusie (free download)

The original solo version of Illusie written by Richard Lenz. Also available for two guitars (as recorded by Duo Lenz). Advanced level.

Many new Duo Lenz editions are available from the Duo Lenz 'Free Scores' (Free Sheet Music Downloads) page for various playing levels. The free editions include worksheets exploring improvisation ideas for 'Malagueña' and 'Pachelbel's Canon', some studies, various guitar solos and an edition of what has become one of the most important works of the classical guitar repertoire, Asturias (Leyenda). All files on the 'Free Scores' page are published to PDF and are free for non-commercial use.
