Born in the 1984 in England, moved to Italy in 1991 and stated playing trumpet at 9 years in the town windband. The studies continued at Catania musical accademy from 1998 to 2003. In the 2004 he was in the military band as first trumpet. Today is first and solo trumpet in a wind band of the north of Italy near Pavia, and is a complete brass section teacher . He also is the directors first technical assistant. Has participated to conducting upgrade courses, several trumpet masterclasses and also to two summer course for young musicians directed by Jakab Gedeon, conductor of the military band of Budapest. In these occasions the conductor has always reserved trumpet solo pieces for him and also, in the 2009, the possibility to conduct personally his music "Fable".

He starting to arrange and compose his music since the age of 14 years, and still continues the research of new sounds, melodies and combination of the both.
